PROPOSITIONS, CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS AND INITIATIVE MEASURES.

FOR THE VETERANS' WELFARE BOND ACT OF 1925. This act provides for a bond issue of twenty million dollars to be used by the veterans' welfare board in assisting California war veterans to acquire farms or homes.

TAXING HIGHWAY TRANSPORTATION COMPANIES. Assembly Constitutional Amendment 37. Adds Section 15 to Article XIII of Constitution. Taxes companies, owning or operating, /as common carriers/ upon public highways between fixed termini or over a regular route, jitney busses, stages or motor vehicles for transporting persons, four and one-quarter per cent, and those so operating trucks for transporting property five per cent, of their gross receipts; exempts property so used from all other taxes and licenses; appropriates half of such taxes to state and half to counties, exclusively for maintaining and repairing public highways; empowers legislature to change such percentages.
