OFFICIAL DECLARATION OF THE RESULT OF THE GENERAL ELECTION HELD THROUGHOUT THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 6, 1928, ON MEASURES SUBMITTED TO A VOTE OF ELECTORS.

The following laws were adopted by vote of electors:

- Number on ballot.
1. REAPPORTIONMENT OF LEGISLATIVE DISTRICTS. (Referendum measure.)
 2. APPROVING CALIFORNIA OLYMPIAD BOND ACT. (Senate Constitutional Amendment.)
 3. TAXATION. (Assembly Constitutional Amendment.)
